## 2025-2026 Selection Policy

1.	<b>Purpose &amp; scope of policy</b>	<p>This Selection Policy sets out how netball athletes (Athletes) are selected by England Netball (EN) into Programmes and Competition squads including:-</p> <p><u>Programmes</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Roses Programme;</li> <li>• Future Roses Programme;</li> <li>• Roses Academy Programme</li> </ul> <p><u>Competition squads</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• England / Vitality Roses</li> <li>• England 'A'</li> <li>• England Under 21</li> <li>• England Under 19</li> <li>• England Under 17</li> <li>• Any other EN Performance or Development squad as may be named from time to time</li> </ul>
2	<b>Performance Mission &amp; Objectives</b>	<p>EN is committed to setting new standards for netball, showcasing inspiring performances by outstanding players in international tournaments. It will support the Roses to achieve recognition and respect as the world's best female sports team, and prepare future Roses athletes for the specific demands of international netball to ensure that there is an oversupply of Roses-ready players available for selection.</p> <p>EN will develop robust talent recruitment systems and processes that allow talented players from all backgrounds to be identified and to access the pathway.</p> <p>Its performance ambition is:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>To reach back-to-back Commonwealth Games and Netball World Cup finals, winning a Gold medal at the 2027 World Cup</i></li> </ul> <p>Selection for Programme and Competition Squads will be based upon the competitive needs of a successful Roses team of the future and be based upon player profiles relevant to each stage of development.</p>
3	<b>Eligibility</b>	<p>To be eligible for selection into the Programmes and Competition Squads listed above, Athletes must:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Be eligible to play for England at the Commonwealth Games and World Netball Championships (as determined by the CGF and WN regulations)</li> </ul>

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		<p>including the World Netball Participation &amp; Inclusion Policy applicable at the appropriate time).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>b. Meet the specific tournament eligibility criteria.</li> <li>c. Have either; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. been born in England, or</li> <li>b. have at least one parent or grandparent of English nationality, or</li> <li>c. are an English citizen, and/or</li> <li>d. have acquired English nationality in accordance with the laws of England, or</li> <li>e. have been legally resident in England for five years immediately prior to the date of entry into the Programme or the date of the international event they are being considered for as part of the Competition Squad (as applicable).</li> </ul> </li> <li>d. Hold a British passport</li> <li>e. Have completed the appropriate UKAD training and education and not be currently serving any sanction for any violation of any relevant anti-doping laws and/or regulations.</li> </ul> <p><u>Note</u>; as long as the Athlete meets all of the eligibility criteria set out in this Eligibility section and meets all of the commitments as set out by the relevant Programme or Competition Squad Head Coach, the Athlete may currently be living and/or competing overseas (for example, as part of the Australian SSN or New Zealand ANZ leagues)</p>
4.	<b>Selection Principles</b>	<p>The following principles will be applied in the course of carrying out the Selection Process:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Selectors will employ an open, transparent and equitable process that gives all Athletes a fair chance to challenge for international selection.</li> <li>b. Selection will be based on merit and the need to achieve the objectives of EN set out in Game Changer 4 of the Adventure Strategy, and detailed above.</li> <li>c. Selection will be made in line with our Diversity &amp; Belonging policy and ensure that selectors and panel members are appropriately trained to eliminate potential unconscious bias</li> <li>d. No Athlete should have the right to, or expectation of, unconditional on-going selection for EN Programmes or Competition Squads.</li> <li>e. Each Selection Panel has the right to determine, at its sole discretion, whether it will re-select Athletes into Programmes or Competition Squads.</li> <li>f. Athletes are required to sign EN Athlete Agreements (which includes the relevant Roses Athlete Handbook) in order to participate in EN Programmes or Competition squads. The terms of the Athlete Agreement that relate to Eligibility and Selection must be adhered to by EN and the Athlete. Athletes may be subject to de-selection if they breach the EN Athlete Agreements or any other relevant EN policies or regulations.</li> <li>g. Athletes will also be expected to sign and adhere to any additional Agreements necessary to ensure their participation in specific tournaments (e.g. Commonwealth Games, Europe Netball etc)</li> </ul>

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>h. The relevant Head Coach has the right to invite Athletes from outside EN Programmes to be observed and considered for inclusion in Competition Squads.</li> <li>i. Given the 'team' nature of netball, regard will be had, not only to the individual Athlete's skill and performance level (as set out in Appendices 2 and 3 below), but also to the combination and balance of Athletes in Programme or Competition Squads, and the ability of Athletes to play in more than one position.</li> </ul>
<b>5.</b>	<b>Selection Process</b>	<p>The process of selection for Programme and Competition Squads is as follows:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Athlete performance at Designated Selection Events (as set out below) will be observed, live or via DVD/HUDL, and – together with any objective performance data - assessed independently and against the selection criteria set out in this Selection Policy. Weighting may be applied to those observations at Designated Selection Events deemed more difficult (based, for example, upon opposition). EN will seek to ensure that athletes are seen multiple times, and by different Athlete Assessors and members of the Selection Panel.</li> <li>b. Following completion of all the Designated Selection Events, the relevant Head Coach will consult with the EN coaching team, and take into account any relevant input from EN's performance, sports science and medical team, along with athletes' club coaches, deemed necessary to make informed Athlete nominations for selection. (Confidential medical information will not be shared but 'red flags' may be raised by staff where Athlete availability or readiness for selection may be compromised)</li> <li>c. The relevant EN Lead Athlete Assessor will consult with the relevant designated EN Athlete Assessors and prepare a standardised report of Athletes nominated for selection on behalf of the Athlete Assessors to be shared with the relevant Selection Panel.</li> <li>d. The nominated Athletes will be those that, in the expert opinion of the relevant Head Coach are most able to achieve the objectives of EN set out in the Performance Mission and Objectives section above.</li> <li>e. The relevant Selection Panel will meet to discuss the Nominated Athletes, check and challenge each other's views, and ensure Athlete selection decisions are evidence-based taking into account the selection criteria outlined in this Selection Policy.</li> <li>f. Any individual Athlete's inclusion in EN Programme or Competition Squads will be decided on a majority vote by all members of the relevant Selection Panel. Where it has not been possible to reach a decision by majority, the relevant Head Coach will have the deciding vote.</li> <li>g. Accurate and detailed records of all selection meetings, data considered, assessments made (including individual scoring) and decisions taken, will be captured and minutes shared with the Selection</li> </ul>

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		<p>Panel, EN Chief Executive and EN Performance Director after each meeting. These should show individual panel members' votes and contributions, and record how any conflicts were managed.</p> <p><u>Designated Selection Events</u></p> <p>These include:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• EN Roses, 'A' team, Future Roses, Under 21, Under 19, Under 17 and any other EN Development squad fixtures</li> <li>• Netball Super League fixtures</li> <li>• SSN / ANZ competition fixtures</li> <li>• NXT Gen, NPL League or NPL Tournament fixtures (or overseas equivalent)</li> <li>• EN Programme activities including training</li> <li>• NSL Team or Pathway Club training events</li> <li>• Other EN-organised competitive fixtures</li> </ul> <p>Priority will be given to data captured and observations made during the previous 12 months, although historic data from previous years may be considered in order to identify performance trends and patterns, or where it has not been possible to capture sufficient data in the previous 12 months</p>
6.	<b>The Athlete Assessors and Membership of Selection Panels</b>	<p>A diverse range of Athlete Assessors will be appointed to observe and assess athletes at Designated Selection Events and to provide feedback to the Lead Athlete Assessors. All Athlete Assessors, including the Leads, will be appointed based upon competency for the role and their knowledge of the requirements of international netball, through an open application process, on a four-year cycle, with an annual review. They will be required to commit to delivering best practice in the field of athlete assessment and to their ongoing learning and development.</p> <p>All Athlete Assessors will be required to declare any conflicts of interest (for example, being connected to an NSL Team or Pathway Club) to the Performance Director or the Head of Player Pathway as and when the conflicts arise. Any conflicts declared will be managed by the meeting Chair. Where possible, England Netball will seek to ensure that Athlete Assessors with a direct conflict of interest (e.g. a direct link to an NSL Team), will not be a voting member of a Selection Panel.</p> <p>A Selection Panel will be established by EN for selecting Programme and Competition squads.</p> <p>The membership of Selection Panels will be on the basis of the criteria set out below:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Selection Panel Members will be appointed by EN's Performance Director.</li> <li>b. There will be 2 independently appointed Lead Athlete Assessors; one will be accountable for EN's Roses and Future Roses Programmes, and</li> </ol>

		<p>associated Competition squads and the second for EN's Roses Academy Programme and associated Competition squads.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>c. Each Selection Panel will be supported by a meeting Secretary to effectively manage conflicts and record decisions made by the panel.</li> <li>d. All Selection Panel members are accountable to EN's Performance Director and ultimately EN's Board for ensuring that this Selection Policy and all associated procedures are applied in a fair and appropriate manner.</li> </ul> <p><b>Roses and Future Roses Programmes and associated Competition Squad panel</b></p> <p>(Competition squads include Vitality Roses, England 'A' and England Under 21)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>e. Programme or Competition squad Head Coach (one vote)</li> <li>f. A designated member of the senior coaching team appointed by the Performance Director (PD) (one vote)</li> <li>g. Lead Athlete Assessor or their delegate drawn from the panel of the Athlete Assessors (one vote)*</li> </ul> <p>* Note that due to the likely spread of athletes to be considered across the NSL and NXT Gen competitions, the England Under 21 Competition Squad Selection Panel will comprise both the Roses and Future Roses Lead Assessor <u>and the Roses Academy Lead Assessor</u></p> <p><b>Roses Academy Programme and associated Competition squad panel</b></p> <p>(Competition Squads include England Under 19 and England Under 17)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>h. Programme or Competition Squad Head Coach (one vote)</li> <li>i. A designated member of the senior or Academy coaching team appointed by the Performance Director (PD) (one vote)</li> <li>j. Lead Athlete Assessor or their delegate drawn from the panel of the Athlete Assessors (one vote)</li> </ul> <p>Details of the current Selection Panels and selectors can be found in Appendix 1.</p> <p>Roses and Future Roses Programmes and associated Competition Squad panel meetings will be chaired by the Performance Director or their appointed representative. Voting members of the selection panel will not chair the meetings.</p> <p>Roses Academy Programme and associated Competition squad panel meetings will be chaired by the Head of Player Pathway, the Performance Director or their appointed representatives. Voting members of the selection panel will not chair these meetings.</p>
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		<p>As set out in 5.f. above, Selection Panel decisions will be made based upon the majority vote (ie 2 or 3 votes against 1 or 0). Where the vote is 1:1 based upon an abstaining member of the Selection Panel, then the respective Head Coach will have the deciding vote.</p> <p>At the discretion of EN Performance Director, additional personnel may be invited to observe and / or provide information to the selection process, but will not participate in any voting, and will be bound by the principle of confidentiality outlined below. This may include, but is not limited to, a Performance Analyst to provide performance data, a minute-taker to record the decisions made, or the respective Head Coach from other relevant national programmes in which the athlete has recently participated.</p>
<b>7.</b>	<b>Selection Appeals</b>	<p>Appeals can only be submitted by a non-selected (or de-selected) Athlete (or their parent/guardian in the case of an Athlete aged under 18) on the grounds that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The selection process outlined in the Selection Process section (section 5) and Athlete Assessors and Selection Panels section (Section 6) above or de-selection process outlined in the Removal, Injury &amp; Replacement (Section 9) below has not been adhered to; or</li> <li>b. The selection (or de-selection) process adopted for that Athlete either failed to consider relevant information which was available at the time, or considered information that they have reason to believe was erroneous</li> <li>c. The Athlete has reason to believe that those involved in the decision making were unreasonably biased</li> </ol> <p>An Athlete may request an appeal on any of the grounds listed above by submitting a written request to the EN Chief Executive Officer (for Roses and Future Roses Programmes and associated Competition Squads) or the EN Performance Director (for Roses Academy and associated Competition Squads). Any appeal must be made within 72hrs of them receiving the formal notification of selection email regarding EN Programme or Competition Squads.</p> <p>Appeals should be made following the “England Netball: Selection Appeals Process” attached – further details can be found on the EN website <a href="http://www.englandnetball.co.uk">www.englandnetball.co.uk</a></p>
<b>8.</b>	<b>Announcement &amp; Notice</b>	<p>EN Roses and Future Roses Programmes:</p> <p>Unless there are factors outside of EN’s control;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Selected Athletes will be sent a formal notification of selection by email within 3 working days after the relevant Selection Panel meeting. At this stage if the selected Athlete does not already have a signed EN Athlete Agreement they will be sent one (which also details the Athlete Performance Award (APA) offer)</li> <li>b. Those Athletes that are being de-selected from an EN Programme, together with those Athletes that have formally expressed an interest to be considered for selection but have not been selected, will be</li> </ol>

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		<p>notified of their non-selection by email within 3 working days after the relevant Selection Panel meeting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>c. Selected Athletes who do not already have a signed EN Athlete Agreement are required to sign and return their Agreements within 14 working days of issue</li> <li>d. Announcements of the Athletes on the EN website will take place after Agreements have been signed and appeals dealt with</li> <li>e. All de-selected Athletes, those Athletes that, in the view of the Selection Panel, might reasonably have expected to have been selected (e.g. having been selected for recent Competition Squads), and any newly selected Athletes, should receive a phone call in advance of the general communication by a member of the Selection Panel</li> <li>f. Any non-selected athletes may request, and be provided with, feedback from the selection panel on the reasons for their non-selection</li> </ul> <p>EN Roses Academy Programme:</p> <p>Unless there are factors outside of EN's control;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>g. Selected Athletes will ordinarily be notified of selection by being sent a formal notification of selection email within 14 working days of the relevant Selection Panel meeting</li> <li>h. Selected Athletes will be expected to sign an EN Athlete Agreement and return their Agreements within 14 working days of issue</li> <li>i. Announcements will be posted on the EN website after this date</li> <li>j. Any non-selected Athletes may request, and be provided with, feedback from the Selection Panel on the reasons for their non-selection</li> </ul> <p>EN Competition Squads:</p> <p>Unless there are factors outside of EN's control;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>k. Notification to selected Athletes and non-selected EN Programme athletes will ordinarily be made within 3 working days after the relevant Selection Panel meeting via a formal notification of selection email.</li> <li>l. Announcements of selections will ordinarily be made and posted on the EN website within 72 hours of Athletes being notified, except where there are ongoing appeals; however, there may be circumstances in which selection announcements have to be made externally whilst appeals are ongoing. This may particularly be the case when the timetable for a particular competition is outside of EN's management</li> </ul>
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		<p>or control; Announcements regarding Commonwealth Games squads cannot be made until they have been ratified by Team England.</p> <p>m. Any non-selected Athletes may request, and be provided with, feedback from the Selection Panel on the reasons for their non-selection</p> <p>Athletes selected to EN Programmes and Competition squads agree not to make any announcement to the media or public in any form (including personal websites or social media sites) regarding their selection until after EN have announced selection decisions on the EN website <a href="http://www.englandnetball.co.uk">www.englandnetball.co.uk</a></p>
9.	<b>Removal, Injury &amp; Replacement</b>	<p>An Athlete may be removed from EN Programme or Competition Squads in the event of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. gross misconduct (as defined in the EN Athlete Disciplinary Policy)</li> <li>b. persistent failure to reach EN's performance expectations in training or competition (see below)</li> <li>c. no longer being available to participate in the Programme or Competition for which they were selected</li> <li>d. an inability to compete to the best of their ability due to an injury and/or illness (see below)</li> </ul> <p><u>Failure to Reach EN's Performance Expectations in training or competition</u></p> <p>The following process will be followed:-</p> <p>At least 7 days prior to the intended de-selection, the Athlete will be informed of the risk of de-selection and the reasons for that risk, and will be presented with the opportunity to attend a de-selection interview (along with a companion if required) with EN's Performance Director (for Roses and Future Roses), Head of Player Pathway (for Roses Academy) and/or relevant Head Coach and, where possible, one other independent person. Written justification must be provided for all removals and will be provided at the point at which the Athlete is notified of their removal.</p> <p>Decisions on de-selection are open to appeal under the appeals process set out in the Appeals section above and the "England Netball: Selection Appeals Process" found on EN website.</p> <p><u>An Inability to Compete Due to an Injury and/or Illness</u></p> <p>The following process will be followed:-</p> <p>Once Athlete selections have been confirmed, all selected Athletes (including the reserve(s)) must not withhold any information on training fitness, injury status or illness that could affect training or competition at any time until the point of the relevant competition. All selected Athletes must declare any</p>

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		<p>medications they are taking, in particular the use of any restricted medications, and submit these to the Team Physician for medical approval.</p> <p>At any stage following the selection of an Athlete to EN's Competition Squads and prior to the relevant competition, should there be any doubt over the ability of a selected Athlete to compete to the best of their ability due to an injury and/or illness, the following procedure will be adhered to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. The Athlete will be referred to one of the Approved Medical Personnel (as set out in this Selection Policy below) to undergo a medical examination to determine their fitness to participate, which at this stage will be determined based on an assessment of whether or not the injury and/or illness is such that the Athlete is physically unable to compete or is at risk of causing medical harm to themselves, or endangering other team members, competitors, officials or spectators.</li> <li>b. If the Athlete passes the medical examination carried out by one of the Approved Medical Personnel (as set out in this Selection Policy below) and/or EN has concerns over whether or not the Athlete is able to compete to the required standard due to an underlying injury and/or illness the Athlete will be required to undertake a further 'Fitness Test' to determine their ability to perform.</li> <li>c. In the event that an Athlete fails to complete the 'Fitness Test' to the required standard, EN's Performance Director and/or relevant Head Coach may recommend that the selected Athlete be de-selected. The decision is open to appeal under the appeals process set out in the Appeals section above and the "England Netball: Selection Appeals Process" found on EN website.</li> </ol> <p><u>Approved Medical Personnel</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• EN Senior or Pathway Physiotherapist</li> <li>• EN Team Doctor</li> <li>• UKSI Regional Doctor or Physiotherapist nominated by the EN Team Doctor</li> </ul>
<b>10.</b>	<b>Selection Criteria</b>	<p>Athletes will be selected based upon the agreed profile of the athletes required by the Roses to achieve future ambitions.</p> <p>Whenever selecting Athletes for EN Programmes and Competition Squads, the relevant Selection Panel shall apply the relevant selection criteria (as set out in Appendix 2 and 3). A grading of 1-4 will be applied when assessing against any and all such selection criteria, with 4 being the highest grading. A breakdown of the specific rating scales for each selection criteria will be made available to Athletes but will not be shared in this Selection Policy document (because this Policy is publicly available).</p>

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		<p>The selection criteria rating for each Athlete will be captured in the Selection Panel minutes.</p> <p>The Panel will also consider 'other factors' listed below within their final selection decisions and will seek to ensure subjective opinions are supported by evidence.</p> <p>Other factors considered will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Availability of the Athlete to fully participate in the Programme or Competition</li> <li>b. Coachability: the Athlete understands expectations and can apply learning and make changes</li> <li>c. The ability of the Athlete to operate effectively within a team</li> <li>d. Current and projected state of fitness, health and wellbeing</li> <li>e. Positional balance and combinations within the team</li> <li>f. Succession planning</li> <li>g. Number of fixtures on the annual international calendar</li> <li>h. Focus of the current year in terms of key international events</li> <li>i. Current and projected form or performance of existing team members</li> <li>j. Balance of experience and youth</li> <li>k. Progress made by the athlete in the previous 12 months</li> <li>l. Whether an Athlete's performance and/or contribution has been affected by extenuating circumstances which may have temporarily compromised their form and/or recent contribution (without compromising confidentiality, indicators of this should be sought from appointed Performance Lifestyle Advisors or Performance Psychologists).</li> </ul> <p>Consideration may also be given to any other such factors that the Selection Panel considers in its sole discretion to be relevant and appropriate to the overall assessment of a particular Athlete; where possible, the Selection Panel should seek to be explicit in defining those factors considered and this should be noted in the minutes.</p> <p>The balance of weighting of all of these factors will be dependent upon the nature and objectives of the Competition or Programme for which Athletes are being selected.</p>
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<b>11.</b>	<b>Review Process</b>	EN's Performance Director will review this Selection Policy on an annual basis in consultation with EN's CEO and EN's coaching team. Proposed changes to this Selection Policy must be approved by EN's Executive Team. Any amendments to this Selection Policy must be given in writing to the Athletes, Head Coaches, other Selection Panel members and other key stakeholders. This Selection Policy (including any final variations or amendments) will be made available on the EN website and made available to all Athletes on request.
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### Confidentiality

All those involved in the nomination and selection process must keep confidential and not disclose any information regarding any aspect of the selection process, nor comment publicly on any nominated or selected Athlete, or national teams unless authorised by EN.

### General

Insofar as is permitted by law, England Netball and its authorised agents do not accept liability for any loss or damage occurring as a result of the selection process. This shall not affect any statutory rights that are available, and this shall not limit or exclude any liability that may not be excluded or limited by law.

If there is any reason to believe that there has been a breach of this Selection Policy or any related terms and conditions, then EN, at its sole discretion, may exclude any Athlete from participating in the selection process.

This Selection Policy shall be governed by English law and, subject to the operation of any appeals as set out in the Appeals section above and the "England Netball: Selection Appeals Process" found on EN website.

### Appendix 1 : Current Athlete Assessors and Selection Panel members

#### **Roses and Future Roses and associated Competition Squads panel**

##### Kat Ratnapala – Lead Athlete Assessor

Kat represented Team Bath in the Super League, was Head Coach at Saracens Mavericks, has worked as Assistant and Technical coach within the England pathway and Roses programme, and until 2023 was Head Coach of the Future Roses Programme. Kat became Lead Athlete Assessor in August 2024.

##### Jess Thirlby – Roses Head Coach

Jess is a former England international that represented Team Bath as a player. She was coach at Celtic Dragons before returning to Team Bath as Head Coach and Director of Netball. She has been Head Coach of the Vitality Roses since 2019.

##### Anna Stembridge - Roses Assistant Coach

Anna is a former Welsh international who was previously Vitality Roses Head Coach and Head Coach at Team Bath in the Netball Super League. Anna returned to the Roses as Assistant Coach in 2024.

(For England Under 21 competition squad selections, Sonia Mkoloma, as Roses Pathway Head Coach replaces Anna Stembridge, whilst - as per section 6 “Athlete Assessors and membership of Selection Panels” above - Jean Davies, as Roses Academy Lead Athlete Assessor, is also a member of the England Under 21 Selection Panel – see below)

##### Other Athlete Assessors

Maggie Birkinshaw represented England Roses more than 60 times, has been Assistant Coach at Yorkshire Jets and Loughborough Lightning and now Leeds Rhinos. She has been a Roses selector / assessor for 7 years.

Sam Bird is a former England international and England A coach that has coached at Superleague level with Saracens Mavericks, Severn Stars and London Pulse, where she is now CEO and Director of Netball.

#### **Roses Academy Programme and associated Competition Squad panel**

##### Jean Davies BEM – Lead Athlete Assessor

Jean represented Cornwall and the West Region as a player before becoming Head Coach to various England pathway teams and development teams at Team Bath. She has been a Roses Academy selector since 2004 and Chair of Selectors since 2016.

##### Sonia Mkoloma – Roses Pathway Head Coach

Sonia is a former England international representing the Roses 123 times, playing domestic netball in England, Australia and New Zealand during her playing career. Following previous stints with the Roses coaching team, she joined as full-time Assistant Coach in the summer of 2021, becoming Roses Pathway Head Coach in March 2024.

### Other National Athlete Assessors

Caroline Ritchie-Morgan has an abundance of pathway coaching experience as well as having been Head Coach of Wales under 19's and assistant to the seniors at the 2006 Commonwealth Games. Caroline coaches at, and is currently Head of Girls' Games, at Wrekin College.

Jan Crabtree was the England Roses Academy Head Coach for 10 years from 2009, and a member of the England Netball senior coaching team. - Availability through court – linking attack and defence
- Feeding the circle
- Defence through court

Wing Defence

- One on one defence at Centre Pass, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> phase
- Working with Centre to defend 2 on 1 at Centre Pass and in attacking third
- Availability on through court attack

Goal Defence

- Restricts possession of Goal Attack both at the Centre Pass and outside the circle
- Working with Goal Keeper to close the circle and limit shooting opportunities and gain possession + Defence of the shot
- Availability on through court attack

Goal Keeper

- Restrict shooting opportunities for Goal Shooter
- Working with Goal Defence to close the circle and limit shooting opportunities and gain possession + Defence of the shot
- Delivery of the back line and support through court
